In the capture the coordinates are in inches but they should be in pixels.

In the tip called "Putting Your Lens Flare on the Spot" the text should read as follows: This tip lets you precisely position the center of the Lens Flare filter by using the Info palette and a little-known feature of the Lens Flare dialog. First, open the Info palette (found under the Window menu), and click on the plus sign next to the X and Y coordinates to change the readings to pixels. Then, put your cursor over the precise spot in your image where you'd like the center of your lens flare to appear. Look in the Info palette and write down the X and Y coordinates (I knew one day I'd find a use for these readings). Go under the Filter menu, under Render, and choose Lens Flare. There's a fairly large preview window in the center of the dialog. Hold the Option key (PC: Alt key), click once on the preview window, and it brings up the Precise Flare Center dialog. Enter those X and Y coordinates you wrote down earlier (you did write them down, right?), click OK, and your lens flare is precisely positioned.
